The rehabilitation patient populations include stroke, spinal cord injury and acquired brain injury inpatient programs and Neurobehavioural Unit. Working on the program requires focusing on preventing complications of physical disability, restoring optimal function and assisting with the adaptation to an altered lifestyle. The RN is adept at coordinating and collaborating with the interdisciplinary team toward the achievement of patient centered goals. In addition to nursing care, the successful candidate will provide support to program participants in all areas of rehabilitation including but not limited to independent living skills and behavior management. Physical activities such as lifting, turning and transferring are required.

- Minimum of 1 year rehabilitation nursing experience
- Knowledge of a Safety Culture in a Health Care Setting in compliance with the OHSA
- Ability and commitment to act as a supervisor under OHSA
- Experience and knowledge of the nursing care needs of the patients recovering from stroke, acquired brain injury or spinal cord injury.
- Ability to apply effective body mechanics and meet the physical demands of the position
- Must be capable of establishing positive interpersonal relationships and able to work as an effective team member

- Demonstrated effective communication skills
- Demonstrated high level of initiative
- Demonstrated ability to apply and document the nursing process
