The Concurrent Disorders Program (CDP) provides outpatient services to adult clients requiring tertiary level care. The successful candidate will have the opportunity to provide comprehensive support/rehabilitation/treatment to clients with serious mental illness and substance abuse disorder using the principles of client centered care within the context of an interprofessional team approach, and frequently in conjunction with community partners.

- Demonstrated ability to apply and document the nursing process
- Ability to relate therapeutically with clients
- Demonstrated leadership in the initiation, coordination of, and participation in team/family conferences and clinical activities
- Excellent communication and interpersonal skills
- Excellent organizational, critical thinking and problem solving skills
- Experience in the development of teaching materials and the teaching of clients, family, and caregivers
- Demonstrated knowledge of and experience in applying the principles of psychosocial rehabilitation
- Travel within the catchment area is required
