The Mental Health Care Program located within St. Joseph's Health Care London at the Parkwood Institute Mental Health Care site, is a tertiary care facility serving the Southwestern Ontario region. Clinical services include inpatient, outpatient and outreach care to individuals 18 years of age and older experiencing severe and persistent mental health challenges.

Reporting to the Director Mental Health Care, an exciting opportunity exists for a psychologist with a focus in the adult population across in and outpatient mental health services. The successful candidate will plan, conduct, and provide expertise and guidance related to psychological services for the adult population including the use of evidence-based assessment, treatment, and consultation, aligned within the psychosocial rehabilitation and recovery model.

As a member of an interdisciplinary team, the psychologist plans, coordinates and provides related research and program evaluation activities. The successful candidate will take a leadership role in education, clinical training and other academic activities within the mental health programs.

Given that St. Joseph's Health Care is affiliated with Western University, psychologists are expected to supervise pre-doctoral clinical residency psychology students as part of the London Clinical Psychology Residency Consortium.

Essential Qualifications

- Valid registration as a Psychologist at the doctoral level with the College of Psychologists of Ontario with are of practice in Clinical Psychology with Adult population.
- Demonstrated experience and proficiency in planning, conducting, administering and interpreting a complete range of psychological assessment techniques, interventions, outcome measurement and evaluations.
- Demonstrated ability to work collaboratively and independently within an interdisciplinary team setting with partners to enhance client care and service delivery.
- Demonstrated experience using a patient centered and recovery approach to effectively engage individuals experiencing severe and persistent mental health challenges.
- Demonstrated experience with and competence in Individual and group interventions, including, but not limited to, structured interventions such as Cognitive Behavioral Therapy and Dialectical Behavior Therapy as well as other annualized and/or evidence-informed treatment modalities.
- Demonstrated experience designing, conducting and communicating the results of applied research and evaluation. Evidence may include refereed publications and presentations; as well as more informal means of dissemination.
- Evidence of continued professional growth and development
- Experience and competence in the supervision of psychometrists and psychology pre and or post-doctoral residents and other related student groups
- Willingness to travel within the region as required
- Demonstrated experience working in a goal oriented, evidence based, and outcome oriented practice
- Demonstrated superior communication (verbal/written), interpersonal and problem solving skills
- Knowledge of Mental Health Act and associated legislation
