Guided by St. Joseph's strategic plan, the Coordinator of Medicine Services will support building regional coalitions that will reach out to the people who need us most and close gaps in care. The incumbent will work to ensure that excellent care is accessible to everyone and will welcome every patient and family caregiver as a person with a unique set of strengths, support networks, spirituality, physical and psychological conditions, and personal goals.

The Coordinator of Medicine Services is responsible for the day to day operation and the coordination of chronic disease management services with the clinical teams in collaboration with Medical Leadership. These clinical services and programs include the Diabetes Education Centre, Diabetes, Endocrinology, & Metabolism Clinics, Clinical Investigation Unit, Osteoporosis Clinic, Cardiac Rehabilitation and Secondary Prevention, Cardiovascular Investigations Unit and COPD/Pulmonary Rehabilitation.

Reporting to the Director, the Coordinator utilizes clinical and leadership skills to ensure quality patient care through the planning, operational management, and coordination of human, financial and physical resources. In addition, the incumbent will play a leadership role in developing St. Joseph's priority of being a leader in the provision of Chronic Disease Management by creating linkages across programs and partner across the region to connect care and services to meet the needs of the whole person. The incumbent will work collaboratively with regional health providers, hospitals, non- governmental organizations, Home and Community Care and South West LHIN leaders in building a more effective care system. Program development and evaluation are integral to this role.
