In addition to the leadership of this project, this role will act as a support to regional and sub-regional initiatives aimed at improving access and flow within our region. This role will work very closely with St. Joseph's Quality, Transformation, and Innovation (QTI) Team as well as key stakeholders and partners at Parkwood Institute Main Building.

Incorporating a project management approach, the successful applicant will provide leadership and at-the-elbow support to the Capacity Optimization Project's executive sponsor, steering and advisory committees and project implementation team. The results of this project will redesign our collective approach to optimizing capacity of our inpatient services at Parkwood Institute Main Building and translate regional and sub-regional information and direction into our site specific workplan.
