The current assignment is within the Acquired Brain Injury program. As a member of the interdisciplinary teams, the Social Worker would be required to provide assessment and rehabilitation services to clients 16 years and over who have experienced a neurological trauma from accident or disease, including people with acquired brain injury, spinal cord injury, multiple trauma, and complex orthopedic injuries. Additionally, the Social Worker will provide counseling and education to patients, family members and service providers in the community. These are community-based programs assisting clients in such settings as home, school, work, etc.
