The successful candidate will have the opportunity to provide comprehensive support/rehabilitation/treatment to clients with serious and persistent mental illness and a developmental disability.

Using the principles of client-centered care and Psychosocial Rehab (PSR) within the context of an inter-professional team approach, frequently in conjunction with community partners.
