Further, The Grants Development Lead supports external grants of greater complexity (e.g. CFI) and large monetary value. The Grants Development Lead is accountable for the effective organization and administration of the internal funding competitions, external relationship management, and establishment and reporting on key performance indicators. Further, this role is critical in providing policy insight and advice to the Manager, Research Operations as well as Director, Research Strategy and Operations. This is a 5 day (37.5 hours) per week position.
