The successful applicant will provide early brain injury education and occupational therapy services to patients referred to the Acquired Brain Injury Outpatient and Outreach Program. Services will be delivered in both one-to-one and group settings, in person and virtually. The role also includes triaging referrals to the program, determining appropriate ABI services for individual patients, developing and delivering educational programming, collaborating with community partners, and participating in relevant quality improvement activities.

This is an ideal opportunity for an occupational therapist seeking to join a team of rehabilitation practitioners who are leaders in rehabilitative care and who are committed to improving patient outcomes and the broader health care system.
